Boasting an attrition rate well below half the national industry average, the company staffs full-time assistive technology engineers and social service case managers, thus providing the traditional vocational and rehabilitation supports required by its employees." NPR's Scott Simon, Master of Ceremonies for the awards presentation, added that "InspiriTec, through a well developed program of vocational rehabilitation and support, encourages staff members to push themselves beyond what other people might consider limitations."
